What are Conspiracy Theories?

Attempts to explain the ultimate causes of significant events and complex circumstances as a result of the workings of <u>secret plots by two or more powerful actors</u>.

- 1. They are fused with everyday lives.
- 2. They are universal.
- 3. They are consequential.




Research Questions:

COVID-19-Specific Expectations

- Uncertainty, worry, fear, sense of powerlessness and isolation

 → embrace conspiracies to explain circumstances and
 regain control, while also projecting these feelings on
 social out-groups (i.e., Asian communities).
- Historically disadvantaged and low status groups most impacted by pandemic → might believe that dominant groups are conspiring against them.
- Pandemic sparks uncertainty, fear, powerless, etc. for those on the right → motivation on the right to embrace theories → narratives that the virus is a "hoax", officials as "working for China"



Dependent Variable: Origin of COVID-19



How Prevalent are COVID-19 Conspiracy Beliefs?






Demographic Results - Conspiracy Belief - USA






Political Factors - Conspiracy Belief - USA

Summary and Future Research

- Conspiracy beliefs are prevalent in both countries, though more so in the United States.
- A mixture of demographic, psychological, and political factors explain COVID-19 conspiracy beliefs, though not the same in each country.
